When we go on holiday, we pack lots of things into the car. There is not a lot of room, so I have to choose the things I really want to bring and leave other things home.





Or we may go in a plane and fly. We will have to pack a suitcase for all the things we wish to take with us and catch a bus or drive to the airport.








When we arrive at the holiday park we will have to stop at the front gate. This is what the front gate will look like.




The pool is great, but it is really deep in some areas, so I should never go near the water without an adult with me.

Most of all, I will remember to relax and have fun.










Going on holiday is lots of fun.
